

## **COLLEGE PROFILE**

South Calcutta Girls' College has a special position in Kolkata heritage. It is the first college established for women in south of Kolkata in 1932 by eminent scholars and educationists like Peary Mohan Chatterjee, after whom the college library is named. It was initially a sister organization of the Beltala Girls' School and functioned as a morning college in the school premises till mid July, 1946. The College then shifted to 72 Sarat Bose Road, Kolkata - 700025, where it stands now. The College celebrated its Platinum Jubilee in 2006-07.

## **MISSION OF THE COLLEGE**

Our College is dedicated to the all-round development of young women, helping them to face the challenges of the modern world. Besides, encouraging educational achievements, our institution also lays emphasis on fostering self-confidence and inculcating the right values so that our students can develop themselves as responsible and aware citizens.

## **CAMPUS LIFE**

**Library:** The College has a fine library stocked with over 22,000 books and journals and a spacious reading room. Besides the Central Library, there are Departmental Seminar Libraries which stock text and reference books, photocopies of important articles and model question papers.

**Hostel:** South Calcutta Girls' College is the only College in the southern part of the city that offers hostel facility. It can at present accommodate 60 boarders. The hostel efficiently runs on a low cost basis and great attention is paid to the cleanliness of the premises, food, discipline and well being of the students.

**Sports:** The College does not have adequate space for outdoor games but it encourages students who have excelled at the District or State level games. There is regular participation in Inter-College Sports Meet. An annual college sports is organized in the month of December. The college has introduced KARATE training and YOGA classes for the students. A badminton court is another addition in the sphere of sports and games.

**Clubs:** There are various interactive clubs which add to the vibrancy of the campus life. The FILM and CINE CLUB frequently organizes film screening for the students and interested viewers from the surrounding locality. The ECO CLUB has been instrumental in organizing Anti-Malaria and Abolishing the use of plastic carry bags in and around the college neighbourhood.

More clubs are added to the existing one, viz. Cultural Club, Quiz Club, Physical Activity Club and Social Awareness Club.

**Social:** The College Social, organized annually, is a platform to showcase in-house talent. The inter college fest "Bahar" organized by the Students' Union, is a vibrant cultural affair that facilitates interaction and creativity among students of different colleges.

**Laboratories:** Bio-Science (Botany, Physiology and Zoology), Chemistry, Geography, Journalism and Mass Communication, Psychology Laboratories are well equipped and students receive individual attention.

## **EDUCATIONAL TOURS**

The educational tours are organized from time to time by all the departments to support classroom teaching. Excursions are compulsory for the students of Botany, Zoology, Physiology and Geography departments.

## SEMINARS / WORKSHOPS / LECTURE SESSIONS

Classroom teaching is supplemented by online resources, seminar, workshops and lecture sessions, where the students get the opportunity to interact among themselves and also with subject experts in their respective fields. At regular intervals, different departments invite guest faculties from other Universities and Colleges to grace our institution and deliver special lectures which broadens the horizon of the students and also their exposure to different aspects of their discipline.

Dr. Tapabrata Guha Roy of the department of community medicine, R.G.Kar Medical College and Hospital, delivered an excellent lecture on HIV-AIDS Awareness Programme. Dr. Roni Sarkar, Assistant Professor of the department of zoology, South Calcutta Girls College, delivered a lecture on Dengue Awareness and its preventive measures.

### PARENT - TEACHER MEETING

A parent-teacher interaction is held during the orientation of the students in the beginning of the Academic Sessions. Along with this, a similar interaction is held in each and every semester to discuss the progress of the students. Guardian's feedback is taken in such meetings.

### COUNSELLING CELL

A Counselling Session is held once a week, in collaboration with the Psychology Department to provide help to students in distress. Moreover, to awake positive career choices, to explore the interest, goal and aspiration of the students, this counselling session is held every Wednesday in college premises from 12 noon to 4 p.m. Regular online counselling process is carried on through virtual platform during the covid-19 pandemic situation.

### PLACEMENT CELL

Tata Consultancy Service (TCS) of Kolkata branch arranges for a online selection programme in every session for projects in Business Process Service (BPS) and Data Processing Role (Non-Voice). Students, who are finally selected, get job placement facility in TCS itself.

### OUT - REACH PROGRAMME

South Calcutta Girls' College has adopted the Peyerabagan Slum area, located in the vicinity, where the Adult literacy Programme was started in 2015. Our college, in collaboration with Peyerabagan Basti Welfare Society, is conducting the programme for the housewives. Our student volunteers participate in the programme regularly throughout the year. Per week, 2/3 students volunteer to visit the Basti Welfare Society to upgrade these adult women. Necessary books are also provided by the college library. Students are working with full enthusiasm to enlighten this backward section of the slum dwellers.

## STUDENT SUPPORT FACILITIES

**Audio-visual Room:** The College is equipped with an audio-visual room for screening of films and Documentaries to supplement regular class room teaching

**Canteen Facility:** Canteen facility is provided for the students and staff of the college.

**Common Room:** It is furnished with indoor games accessories like Table Tennis Board, Carom Board, Chess Board etc. From 2014-15, the Common Room Committee introduced inter-department indoor games competition which commences from last week of August till November. Winners and Runners are awarded.

**Gymnasium:** It is well equipped and one female Gym-instructor is available there in college hours.

**Banking facilities:** A branch of HDFC Bank is located within the college premises for easy financial transactions.

**Students' Health Home:** The College is concerned about Students' Health. Every student is enrolled on payment of annual subscription of Rs.10 only. Free medical facilities are offered by the "Health Home".

**Students' Aid Fund:** The College provides half/full free studentship to needy and meritorious students. There is also provision for book grants to such students. Along with this, the West Bengal Govt. sponsored Kanyasree Prakalpa and West Bengal Minorities Development and Finance Corporation (WBMDFC) have also been active to grant scholarships to needy students.

**Students' Union:** Every student is a member of the Students' Union (an elected body by the students) which organizes various activities from time to time and takes part in College Management.

**Cheap Store:** A cheap store within the college premises, stocks University text books, question papers, stationery and other accessories. This store is ready to meet student-requirements.

**Travel Concession:** Travel concessions are available to students for travel by air, train or bus within India.

**Grievance Redressal Cell:** Monitored by senior members of the academic staff, the cell deals with problems faced by students. Students are free to write about their grievances without revealing their identities.

**Alumnae Association:** The Alumnae Association of South Calcutta Girls' College named PRAYAS has taken keen interest in the welfare of the College and its development. It ensures a steady interaction between bonafide and ex-students.

**CCTV & Wi-fi Zone:** The College is equipped with CCTV facilities to ensure the security of the students.

**Vocational Training Course:** Tailoring and Beautician courses are running in the college successfully.

**Smart Class Room:** A major addition to the facilities for the students are the introduction of smart class rooms.

**Job-Orient Course:** Webel Informatics Ltd. (A Govt. of West Bengal Undertaking Organization) is providing two year specially designed diploma in PC application course during college hours.

Rotary Club, Metro City organizes regular health awareness camps.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

College Timing : Classes are held from 10.00 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Saturday.

Discipline :

Admission of the student implies an undertaking on the part of the student and their guardians to respect the rules and discipline of the College. Courteous behaviour is what we expect from all and render to all. The College reserves the right to issue Transfer Certificates in case of breach of discipline.

Rules :

- i) The students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
- ii) Students must consult the College Notice Board everyday and comply, failing which the College will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them.
- iii) Students must wear the Identity Card issued by the College everyday on the college premises.
- iv) Attendance in regular classes and tutorials is compulsory for the students.
- v) Disciplinary action will be taken against any student using unfair means during examination.
- vi) Students must attend all extra-curricular activities organized by the Institution.
- vii) The tuition fees must be paid through the bank, twice a year, (at the time of admission and in the month of January).
- viii) *Students must take their mark-sheets, registration certificates within one month of the issue of notice by the office, failing which the college will not be responsible for the above-mentioned Documents.*

### ATTENDANCE

- A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes\* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

\*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.

- Marks allotted for attendance –
  - Attendance 60% or above but less than 75% — 6 Marks
  - Attendance 75% or above but less than 90% — 8 Marks
  - Attendance 90% or above — 10 Marks

### CBCS EXAMINATION REGULATIONS

Students are asked to follow University Notifications No. CSR/3/18, dt. 07.05.2018 and CSR/4/18, dt.07.05.2018, containing new Admission & Examination Regulations for semester – wise three-year (six semesters) B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/General) and B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Major) Courses of Studies under CBCS.

- The 3 year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours and General) Course of Studies under CBCS shall consist of Six (6) Semesters (Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V and Semester-VI).
- End Semester Examinations are to be held ordinarily at the end of the concerned Semester, i.e., Semester - I, Semester - III, Semester - V in December - January and Semester - II, Semester - IV, Semester - VI in June-July.
- End Semester Examinations will be held for 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. 50% of the total marks assigned to Internal Assessment (i.e., 10 marks for a full paper of 100 or 5 marks for a Module of 50, as the case may be) will be assessed on the basis of Internal Examination and remaining 50% will be assessed based on the class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission whichever is later).

The students are advised to fulfill the above conditions to make themselves eligible to appear at the examination, failing which their applications will not be forwarded to the Calcutta University. A candidate for whom the Migration is required must submit the Migration Certificate in original within one month of admission to this College. Otherwise her Registration form cannot be forwarded to Calcutta University, in which case the College will not be responsible if the University refuses to issue Admit Card to her for the Final Examination. Attendance in field work for Geography Honours/General, Zoology Honours/General, Botany Honours/General and Physiology General is compulsory. Students have to secure a Clearance Certificate from Geography/Botany/Zoology and Physiology Departments on satisfactory completion of field report.

## RULES OF THE LIBRARY

- On payment of the Library deposit and on production of admission receipt and two copies of recent coloured photos, each student will be provided with a Library Card. *Library Cards are non-transferable.*
- Loss of Library Card must be reported immediately to the Librarian and a fresh card will be issued on payment of Rs. 10/-.
- No student will be allowed in the Library without Library Card.
- Honours students may borrow four books at a time and General course students may borrow two books only. Books must be returned within 15 days from the date of issue.
- If the books are returned after the due date, borrowing facility will be temporarily withdrawn and a fine will be charged.
- Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. Till the damage is made good, the borrower will have no right to use the Library.
- Students must renew their library cards after they are promoted to 3<sup>rd</sup> semester and 5<sup>th</sup> semester.
- Students seeking transfer and students appearing in Part I, Part II and Part III Examination must obtain a Clearance Certificate from the Librarian before a Certificate or Admit Card is issued.
- Each student must attend the library and either read or do other library-works on their subjects as per college routine.

### COURSE OF STUDY

The College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and offers B.A. and B.Sc. three year Honours and General courses. Examination pattern and marks distribution in the CBCS system for B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/General) courses of studies are effective for the academic session 2019-20.

## OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM FOR B.A./B.SC. PROGRAMME

### A. Core Course (CC)

A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

### B. Elective Course

Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

i) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses which may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. This course is to advance knowledge and skill in the core course domain.

ii) Generic Elective (GE) Course :

An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek wide exposure, is called Generic Elective.

N.B. : A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective. [A Core Course (CC) of B.A./B.Sc. General may be treated as Generic Elective for B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) and B.A. (General)].

### C. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

The Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

a. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) : AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

i) AECC1 : Communicative English / MIL (Bengali);

ii) AECC2 : Environmental Studies.

b. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills, etc.

#### • Practical/ Tutorial

Every Core, Discipline Specific and Generic Elective Course shall have a Practical/Tutorial component. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no tutorial and viceversa.

## PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION TO DEGREE COURSE

Students are hereby notified that South Calcutta Girls' College will accept all types of fees and charges (including Application, Admission etc.) in CASHLESS mode only.

## 2020-21 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

1. Candidates who passed H.S.(10+2) Examination conducted by the WBCHSE or its equivalent examination are eligible to seek admission to the first Semester of the UG Courses of studies provided they have also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100.
2. Candidates having practical based subjects must pass separately in Theory and Practical papers.
