COLLEGE PROFILE

South Calcutta Girls' College has a special position in Kolkata heritage. It is the first college established for women in south of Kolkata in 1932 by eminent scholars and educationists like Peary Mohan Chatterjee, after whom the college library is named. It was initially a sister organization of the Beltala Girls' School and functioned as a morning college in the school premises till mid July, 1946. The College then shifted to 72 Sarat Bose Road, Kolkata - 700025, where it stands now. The College celebrated its Platinum Jubilee in 2006-07.

MISSION OF THE COLLEGE

Our College is dedicated to the all-round development of young women, helping them to face the challenges of the modern world. Besides, encouraging educational achievements, our institution also lays emphasis on fostering self-confidence and inculcating the right values so that our students can develop themselves as responsible and aware citizens.

NAAC ASSESSMENT

On 2016, in the second NAAC visit this esteemed institution has been awarded Grade B++.

RECIPIENT OF RUSA GRANT

The total sanctioned amount under RUSA 2.0 is two crore. The college has received Rs one crore in 2019 - 20, and Rs fifty lakh in 2020 - 21.

CAMPUS LIFE

WORKING HOURS: 10 A.M. TO 5 P.M.

Library: The College has a fine library stocked with over 22,000 books and journals and a spacious reading room. Besides the Central Library, there are Departmental Seminar Libraries which stock text and reference books, photocopies of important articles and model question papers.

Hostel: South Calcutta Girls' College is the only College in the southern part of the city that offers hostel facility. It can at present accommodate 60 boarders. The hostel efficiently runs on a low cost basis and great attention is paid to the cleanliness of the premises, food, discipline and well being of the students.

Sports: The College does not have adequate space for outdoor games but it encourages students who have excelled at the District or State level games. There is regular participation in Inter-College Sports Meet. An annual college sports is organized in the month of December. The college has introduced KARATE training and YOGA classes for the students. A badminton court is another addition in the sphere of sports and games.

Clubs: There are various interactive clubs which add to the vibrancy of the campus life. The **FILM and CINE CLUB** frequently organizes film screening for the students and interested viewers from the surrounding locality. The **ECO CLUB** has been instrumental in organizing **World Earth Day** through poster-presentation competition by students. World Environment Day was also observed to bring awareness regarding the green environment surrounding us.

More clubs are added to the existing one, viz. **Cultural Club**, **Quiz Club**, **Physical Activity Club** and **Social Awareness Club**.

Social: The College Social, organized annually, is a platform to showcase in-house talent. The inter college fest "**Bahar**" organized by the Students' Union, is a vibrant cultural affair that facilitates interaction and creativity among students of different colleges.

Laboratories: Bio-Science (Botany, Physiology and Zoology), Chemistry, Geography, Journalism and Mass Communication, Psychology Laboratories are well equipped and students receive individual attention.

EDUCATIONAL TOURS

The educational tours are organized from time to time by all the departments to support classroom teaching. Excursions are compulsory for the students of Botany, Zoology, Physiology and Geography departments.

NSS

A unit of National Service Scheme has been functioning in our college since 2009. In the year 2021-22, it engaged itself in various activities following the NSS motto "NOT ME, BUT YOU". A Covid awareness programme and student rally was organized in college surroundings with special emphasis on Beltala Motor Vehicle Slum area. Besides, mask distribution and eye check-up camp, health check-up camp, sanitizer preparation, psychological counselling and yoga-sessions are also organised during the special camp. Aids awareness programme is another noteworthy venture of NSS unit. A poster - competition was also arranged to celebrate the International Women's Day along with the hands on training programme of bio-compost making at home.

MENTOR-MENTEE SYSTEM AND PARENT-TEACHER MEETING

A strong student mentoring system is available in this institution which has been introduced since 2019-20. A database of students containing the personal, academic, financial, health, extra-curricular activity

details are prepared and maintained by the mentor. The overall development of a student is monitored and guided by the mentor.

COUNSELLING CELL

The Counselling Cell is active on every Wednesday from 12 noon to 4 pm. Taking care of mental health is of utmost importance to stay focused on daily activity schedule. College do respect confidentiality of each session as students share their personal feelings. Throughout the year, counselling cell stays active with different activities like celebration of World Mental Health day and World Suicide Prevention Day etc. Online activites like anger management, motivational counselling session prior to examination have also been organized. The cell tries to awake positive career choices among the students and explore their interest, goal and aspiration.

PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell of South Calcutta Girls' College prepares the students to face campus interviews imparting training in employable skills. In the session 2021-22, due to pandemic, no such on campus recruitment was possible. But a Webinar was organized to help the students to prepare themselves for job requirements and interviews.

Staff Selection Commission visited the campus and organized a seminar on "Awarness Programme on Competitive Examination" to help the students and to make them aware about the current aspects of job requirements.

STUDENT SUPPORT FACILITIES

Audio-visual Room: The College is equipped with an audio-visual room for screening of films and Documentaries to supplement regular class room teaching.

Canteen Facility: Canteen facility is provided for the students and staff of the college.

Common Room: It is furnished with indoor games accessories like Table Tennis Board, Carom Board, Chess Board etc. From 2014-15, the Common Room Committee introduced inter-department indoor games competition which commences from last week of August till November. Winners and Runners are awarded.

 $\textbf{Gymnasium:} \ It is well equipped and one female Gym-instructor is available there in college hours.$

Online Fees Pyment: Payment of fees is done through college portal, where students are to log-in for the necessary payments.

Students' Health Home: The College is concerned about Students' Health. Every student is enrolled on payment of annual subscription of Rs. 10 only. Free medical facilities are offered by the "Health Home".

Students' Aid Fund: The College provides half / full free studentship to needy and meritorious students. There is also provision for book-grant to such students.

Students' Union: Every student is a member of the Students' Union (an elected body by the students) which organizes various activities from time to time and takes part in College Management.

Cheap Store: A cheap store within the college premises, stocks University text books, question papers, stationery and other accessories. This store is ready to meet student-requirments.

Travel Concession: Travel concessions are available to students for travel by air, train or bus within India.

Grievance Redressal Cell: Monitored by senior members of the academic staff, the Cell deals with problems faced by students. Students are free to write about their grievances without revealing their identities. Since the COVID Pandemic situation, the cell is working online, where the link is provided in the college website.

Alumnae Association: The Alumnae Association of South Calcutta Girls' College named PRAYAS has taken keen interest in the welfare of the College and its development. It ensures a steady interaction between bonafide and ex-students.

CCTV & Wi-fi Zone: The College is equipped with CCTV facilities to ensure the security of the students.

Vocational Training Course: Tailoring and Beautician Courses have been introduced in our college.

Smart Class Room: A major addition to the facilities for the students are the introduction of smart class rooms.

Job-Orient Course: Webel Informatics Ltd. (A Govt. of West Bengal Undertaking Organization) is providing two year specially designed diploma in PC application course during college hours.

Yoga Class: Online Yoga class has been introduced from August 2020. The target of this programme is to make the students physically and mentally strong and stress free particularly in the pandemic situation.

Rotary Club, Metro City organizes regular health awareness camps.

GENERAL INFORMATION

College Timing: Classes are held from 10.00 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Saturday. **Discipline:**

Admission of the student implies an undertaking on the part of the student and their guardians to respect the rules and discipline of the College. Courteous behaviour is what we expect from all and render to all. The College reserves the right to issue Transfer Certificates in case of breach of discipline.

Rules:

- i) The students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
- ii) Students must consult the College Notice Board everyday and comply, failing which the College will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them.
- iii) Students must wear the Identity Card issued by the College everyday on the college premises.
- iv) Attendance in regular classes and tutorials is compulsory for the students.

- v) Disciplinary action will be taken against any student using unfair means during examination.
- vi) Students must attend all extra-curricular activities organized by the Institution.
- vii) The tuition fees must be paid through the bank, twice a year, (at the time of admission and in the month of January).
- viii) Students must take their mark-sheets, registration certificates within one month of the issue of notice by the office, failing which the college will not be responsible for the above-mentioned Documents.

ATTENDANCE

- A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.
 - *Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.
- Marks allotted for attendance
 - Attendance 60% or above but less than 75% 6 Marks
 - Attendance 75% or above but less than 90% 8 Marks
 - Attendance 90% or above 10 Marks

STUDENTS ARE TO NOTE THAT: RAGGING IS TOTALLY BANNED. CBCS EXAMINATION REGULATIONS

Students are asked to follow **University Notifications No. CSR/3/18, dt. 07.05.2018** and **CSR/4/18, dt.07.05.2018**, containing **new Admission & Examination Regulations** for semester – wise three-year (six semesters) **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/General)** and **B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Major)** Courses of Studies under CBCS.

- The 3 year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours and General) Course of Studies under CBCS shall consist of Six (6) Semesters (Semester-I, Semester-II, Semester-III, Semester-IV, Semester-V and Semester-VI).
- End Semester Examinations are to be held ordinarily at the end of the concerned Semester, i.e., Semester I, Semester III, Semester V in **December January** and Semester II, Semester IV, Semester VI in **June-July**.
- End Semester Examinations will be held for 80% of the total marks in each paper and Internal Assessment shall be for 20% of the total marks of each paper/subject/module. 50% of the total marks assigned to Internal Assessment (i.e., 10 marks for a full paper of 100 or 5 marks for a Module of 50, as the case may be) will be assessed on the basis of Internal Examination and remaining 50% will be assessed based on the class attendance (6 marks for attending 60% or above but less than 75% of the number of lectures delivered; 8 marks for attending 75% or above but less than 90% of the number of lectures delivered; and 10 marks for attending 90% or above of lectures delivered and such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission

whichever is later).

The students are advised to fulfill the above conditions to make themselves eligible to appear at the examination, failing which their applications will not be forwarded to the Calcutta University. A candidate for whom the Migration is required must submit the Migration Certificate in original within one month of admission to this College. Otherwise her Registration form cannot be forwarded to Calcutta University, in which case the College will not be responsible if the University refuses to issue Admit Card to her for the Final Examination. Attendance in field work for Geography Honours/General, Zoology Honours/General, Botany Honours/General and Physiology General is compulsory. Students have to secure a Clearance Certificate from Geography/Botany/Zoology and Physiology Departments on satisfactory completion of field report.

RULES OF THE LIBRARY

- On payment of the Library deposit and on production of admission receipt and two copies of recent coloured photos, each student will be provided with a Library Card. Library Cards are non-transferable.
- Loss of Library Card must be reported immediately to the Librarian and a fresh card will be issued on payment of Rs. 10/-.
- No student will be allowed in the Library without Library Card.
- Honours students may borrow four books at a time and General course students may borrow two books only. Books must be returned within 15 days from the date of issue.
- If the books are returned after the due date, borrowing facility will be temporarily withdrawn and a fine will be charged.
- Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. Till the damage is made good, the borrower will have no right to use the Library.
- Students must renew their library cards after they are promoted to the next semester.
- Students seeking transfer and students appearing in 6th Semester and Part III Examination must obtain a Clearance Certificate from the Librarian before a Certificate or Admit Card is issued.

COURSE OF STUDY

The College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and offers B.A. and B.Sc. three year Honours and General courses. Examination pattern and marks distribution in the CBCS system for B.A./B.Sc. (Honours/General) courses of studies are effective for the academic session 2022-23.

OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM FOR B.A./B.SC. PROGRAMME

A. Core Course (CC)

A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

B. Elective Course

Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

- i) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses which may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. This course is to advance knowledge and skill in the core course domain.
- ii) Generic Elective (GE) Course:

An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek wide exposure, is called Generic Elective.

N.B.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective. [A Core Course (CC) of B.A/B.Sc. General may be treated as Generic Elective for B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) and B.A. (General)].

C. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

The Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC).

- **a.** Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.
- i) AECC1: Communicative English / MIL (Bengali);
- ii) AECC2: Environmental Studies.

- **b. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills, etc.
- Practical/Tutorial

Every Core, Discipline Specific and Generic Elective Course shall have a Practical/Tutorial component. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no tutorial and viceversa.

PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION TO DEGREE COURSE

Students are hereby notified that South Calcutta Girls' College will accept all types of fees and charges (including Application, Admission etc.) in **CASHLESS mode** only.

It is also notified that the transaction charges, over and above the fees, are to be borne by the candidates.

2022 - 23 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- 1. Candidates who passed H.S.(10+2) Examination conducted by the WBCHSE or its equivalent examination are eligible to seek admission to the first Semester of the UG Courses of studies provided they have also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100.
- 2. Candidates having practical based subjects must pass separately in Theory and Practical papers.
